Additional Curriculum Requirements

Encounter

Encounter is the Adventist Schools Australia Bible curriculum that is mandatory for all schools within ASV to deliver. Schools within ASV are required to deliver the Encounter curriculum across four days each week, with the understanding that on the fifth day a Chapel program is run. It is also a requirement that Worship time be in addition to Encounter time, not included within the Encounter time.

KS:CPC

The Keeping Safe: Child Protection Curriculum (KS:CPC) is a program developed for schools by the South Australian Department of Education and has been subscribed for use within ASV Schools. The curriculum teachers all children from a young age, in an age appropriate way, to:

- Recognise abuse and tell a trusted adult about it
- Understand what appropriate and inappropriate touching
- Understand ways of keeping themselves safe
