SECONDARY SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

Year 7 to 9, 2028 – 2030

Edinburgh College is a co-educational college offering Early Learning through to Year 12. Our scholarship program recognises a range of student talents that are consistent with our belief in the holistic development of each student. In addition to academic development, we recognise and seek to enhance each student's spiritual, physical and social development.

Scholarships are available for students entering Year 7 in 2028 and provide up to a 50% discount on annual tuition fees until the end of Year 9.

Edinburgh College offers scholarships in the following categories:

Academic Excellence - Awarded to students who demonstrate exceptional academic achievement, a love of learning, and a commitment to pursuing excellence across their studies.

Leadership and Service - Recognises students who display strong leadership qualities and actively use their influence to make a meaningful impact in their school and wider community, reflecting the values of service, compassion, and integrity.

Innovation in STEAM - Celebrates students who show curiosity, creativity, and advanced ability in Science, Technology, Engineering, the Arts, and Mathematics—applying these skills to explore, innovate, and serve others.

Sport - Awarded to students who excel in a chosen sporting discipline and demonstrate dedication, teamwork, and sportsmanship both on and off the field.

Performing Arts - Recognises students who show outstanding talent and commitment in the performing arts, including music, drama, and dance—expressing creativity and storytelling through performance.

Who can apply?

Applications are welcomed from the following students:

- New and existing students of Edinburgh College
- Applications close Friday 18 September 2027

Terms and conditions of Scholarship

Eligibility - Scholarships are open to Australian citizens or permanent residents. Year 7 scholarships are available to both internal and external applicants; Year 10 scholarships are for current students only.

Value and Duration - Scholarships provide up to a 50% tuition fee concession (excluding levies) and are valid for three years, up to the end of 2030. Only one fee concession can apply per student.

Expectations

Recipients must:

- Maintain satisfactory academic progress, attendance, and conduct
- Actively engage in College life beyond their area of scholarship
- Support the Christian mission and ethos of Edinburgh College

Review and Continuation - Scholarships are subject to annual review. Failure to meet expectations may result in withdrawal of the scholarship. Families will be notified of any concerns and given the opportunity to respond.

Withdrawal from the College - Students who withdraw before the scholarship term ends may be required to repay the tuition concession received. Exceptions may apply for relocation due to family circumstances.

Appeals - Appeals relating to scholarship decisions must be addressed in writing to the Principal. The College's decision is final.

3. Complete and return the scholarship application by the due date.
