



Across the campus this language and behaviour is used, modelled and fostered in every situation. PB4L encourages positive student voice and relationships nurturing children of character and service. We also have a Wellbeing Officer who leads this area and responds to any needs amongst the student body. A Counsellor and Ministerial Pastor are also available each day for counselling or wellbeing support.

Shared learning spaces

Edinburgh College campus encompasses many learning spaces that provide different and exciting learning opportunities. These spaces are shared by all three departments individually and together.

Library

Our library offers a large collection of books that can be enjoyed in class reading, independent reading and even home reading for the Primary and Secondary students. In the Early Learning Centre, children are invited to borrow books to take back and read at kinder. At times, our ELC and Preps will enjoy this space together reading books growing our love of learning, growing and community all together.

Multi-purpose hall (MPC)

Our Primary and ELC departments make use of the large and equipped multi-purpose hall to un sports and body development activities such as the Perceptual Motor Program (PMP) to allow children to have fun while implicitly improving their bodies fine and gross motor skills, team work and working memory.

Bush kinder

Our school is located on beautiful land that even sees visits and homes some wildlife such as kangaroos and many birds. This offers great space for investigation and enjoyment. The students of the ELC partake in a bush kinder program that see them learning in and of our natural world in these outdoor spaces. As part of our buddies program, these spaces are shared for toasting marshmallows, toasting bread and fantastic real world learning together.

Playground

Our school boasts a well-equipped and enjoyable playground under the shade of huge pine trees creating the perfect play area. Children from ELC, Prep and the rest of the Primary classes often enjoy this space together practicing safe play, group play and developmental play.







Encounter

Edinburgh College is a Seventh Day Adventist school committed to teaching and fostering relationships with God. From Early Learning to VCE, Encounter is a continuum program that sees students exposed to and investigating Gods word and His relevance to their life. We nurture a culture of faith and love with God always at the centre. We walk students' Christian journey with them and enjoy watching them flourish. Encounter is a hands on and engaging program that allows even little minds to begin to comprehend the enormity of God's love and friendship with them.



Chapel

Each Friday in the Primary school, Kindergarten children join with the Primary School children to worship God through music and devotion. Chapel runs for approximately 45 minutes where the students sing songs and hear from our school Chaplain or a guest speaker who share a message that reflects our mission statement and PB4L values. All year levels including the ELC have the opportunity to host Chapel and lead worship. Chapel is always an anticipated part of our week and an encouraging time together. Edinburgh College Secondary continues Chapel though they complete this at a time more keeping with their timetable.

Buddies

In term 2 and 3, Prep and the ELC Kindergarten rooms meet weekly for buddies. Buddies is a great way for us to support our little minds take on new roles as teachers and school learners. Together we enjoy outdoor play, targeted age appropriate Literacy and Maths activities, music, dance, movement and most importantly, we enjoy each other's company. This buddies program invites Kindergarten students into the school classrooms and helps to prepare them for the environment they are working to be in full time once they begin school. Through buddies, ELC students come to school already having friends and already knowing their teachers and have a basic idea of their way around. We love this time together and all the opportunities for success that come from this.

Literacy Program

As an Edinburgh community we are committed to providing quality education to provide students with real skills that will help them be successful. We want your child to feel successful and be prepared as they learn and move between spaces and year levels. For this reason we collaborate and plan our curriculums together so that each year of Literacy extends from the year prior. In our early years we run the Jolly Phonics literacy program and include and embed elements of Cued Articulation to support speech development and other fun stories and tricks to support students consolidate their learning. By working together on a carefully planned continuum, the literacy expectations for students each year is more achievable and more attainable.

Mathematics Program

Similarly to our Literacy Program, Mathematics is taught as a continuum that supports students holistic and long term learning. Teaching is carefully planned to cater for the age group and see students using Mathematics in context in all situations through intentional language, hands on experiences and then explicit teaching. We make it our goal to make Maths across the early years a colourful and engaging learning space where children come to appreciate the



incredibly important and useful language that Mathematics is.

STEAM

Edinburgh College is committed to providing a holistic education that caters for all students needs and interests. By actively embedding STEAM into our programs we allow children to be exposed to different types of learning and big picture ideas. Together with the ELC, the Prep students engage in STEM incursions including Science and through buddies they engage Mathematics and Arts. The ELC is also included includes Digital Technologies at the most introductory level for the following Foundation to Year 2 curriculum to build on.



Perceptual Motor Program (PMP)

Cognitive learning is at its richest when students are whole body learning. The Perceptual Motor Program is a program that strengthens and builds children's fine and gross motor skills as well as working memory. It works to include elements of Brain Gym and prepares students bodies for learning regulating their bodies and emotions. Both the ELC and the early primary years include PMP into their programs targeting children at their most ready age for development and growth.





Transition to school

Transition reports

At the duration of your Kinder years, your child's Kindergarten teacher will complete school readiness testing including basic literacy and mathematics skills and will compile this, along with all social and emotional progression points into a Transition Report. This report is available to you as parents and is passed onto the Prep teachers for them to gauge the skills and strategies that your child is coming to school with. This helps us be prepared not only for a new cohort but specifically for your child. On handover of these transition reports, the Kindergarten teachers are also able to pass on any notes to the Prep teachers that you think is necessary. Space is allowed for this on the report as we honour that we are all partners in this journey.



In the year prior to your child beginning Prep, Edinburgh offers three orientation days where your child comes to school for a few hours in the morning. During this time the children are invited to explore their future classroom, interact with their future peers and meet and greet their teachers for comfort and becoming familiar. Teachers run a purposefully planned program for the day that allows them to see evidence of the things reported in the transition reports and to make a note of any new observations. Following these orientation days, teachers are very happy to discuss how your child performed and interacted.

Information evenings

Leading Educators at the Early Learning Centre run information nights at the beginning of your child's year to inform you of their program and pathway for the year. This is a time to welcome you into the learning space and the community and to share the important dates and details of the year.

Similarly, when your child is enrolled to begin Prep at Edinburgh College, in the October of the prior year we welcome parents to a meet and greet information night. At this time we invited you to come with your questions to work with you to make your child's transition as smooth and enjoyable for them and for you. This is also a great opportunity to meet your child's teachers and the community that you are coming into. We are excited to see you there.

We also welcome you to attend one or both of our school Open Nights that are held each year. These are fun and engaging demonstrative nights of the exciting learning that we pursue and the success we achieve at Edinburgh College. Please contact our College office at the beginning of the year or keep a watch on the College website to confirm dates.

Meeting with the teachers

If you feel that you need to meet a teacher one-on-one to discuss your child's introduction to Prep please contact either the Primary or the ELC administration to begin this organisation. We are always happy to work with you to make sure that you feel supported before and during your time here with us. If you feel it would be helpful for your child's current Kindergarten educator to be present we are happy to oblige this for some specific handover.
