Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability (NCCD) In the coming weeks, NCC, along with every other school in Australia, will participate in the Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability (NCCD). The NCCD process is an Australian Government requirement for schools to identify information already available in the school about supports provided to students with disability.

The NCCD provides the school, State and Federal Governments with the information they need to plan for the support of students with disability.

The NCCD will have no direct impact on your child and your child will not be involved in any testing process.

The school will provide data to the Australian Government in such a way that no individual student will be able to be identified – the privacy and confidentiality of all students is ensured. All information is protected by privacy laws that regulate the collection, storage and disclosure of personal information. # ENROLMENT UPDATE

We have some exciting news to share from the Enrolment team. Our strong academic results in both primary (NAPLAN) and secondary (NAPLAN and VCE) are driving up enrolments at a rapid rate.

This year, we added an extra Grade 5/6 class which is steadily filling, and in 2024, we are adding a third stream Year 7 class. The 2025 Year 7 class is already filling.

Our Year 5 students are now being invited to apply for Year 7 in 2025 in order to secure a place.

While we do all we can to prioritise, encourage and assist our students to step up to Year 7 and secondary life with us here at NCC, it is not an automatic transition; there is a process.

Here are the steps:

- 1. Complete the abbreviated application form
- 2.Book an interview time slot
- 3. Interview and review of the application by Enrolment Committee
- 4.Upon receipt of the Enrolment documents, complete the acceptance and return it to the Enrolment Officer, together with the receipt for payment of the commitment fee.
- 5. Relax because your child's place is then secured in Year 7 2025 at NCC!

The Global Academic Challenge is a competition from the Australian Council for Educational Research (ACER) and provides students with the opportunity to challenge themselves with questions of an international standard and to see how their results compare to both an international and Australian cohort.

#### OUTSTANDING RESULTS IN CAT MATHEMATICS COMPETITION 2023

# YEAR 10 JEWISH HOLOCAUST MUSEUM

The Year 10's visited the Jewish Holocaust Museum as part of the History studies. Year 10 students are currently studying World War II. To consolidate work in class, particularly relating to a significant event such as the Holocaust that has continued to have repercussions in the modern world, students visited the Jewish Holocaust Museum to experience the devastation of the Holocaust through survivors' eyes. Students were able to speak to a survivor, Dr. Jack Leder, and ask him questions about his experiences during the Holocaust - a privilege the next generation will never be able to experience.
