






2024 STUDENT COMPOSITION

SCHOOL CONTEXT

North West Christian School is a co-educational day school operated by the Seventh-day Adventist Church. Established in 1974 and located in Penguin, Tasmania. The school caters to students from Early Learning to Year 12. It boasts a dedicated team of staff who are committed to providing a comprehensive education that fosters both academic excellence and personal growth.

ACADEMIC EXCELLENCE

North West Christian School has an outstanding reputation for academic excellence, underpinned by a robust teaching and learning framework that encourages students to be forward thinkers and problem solvers. The curriculum extends beyond traditional academics to include a unique blend of artistic, sporting, outdoor educational and service learning experiences. These programs aim to develop self-belief, courage, leadership, and resilience in students.

VALUES AND PROGRAMS

The school is dedicated to the spiritual, academic, and co-curricular development of its students. The programs provide opportunities for students to explore and develop their talents and potential. 



Community Feedback









FINANCIAL OVERVIEW

EXPENDITURE





Our income is predominantly sourced from government grants, which contribute almost 90% of total revenue, while fees and other income provide just under 10% collectively. On the expenditure side, nearly 68% is allocated to salaries and related costs, underscoring our commitment to investing in quality staffing. Additional spending is directed towards teaching materials (approximately 6%), facilities and infrastructure (around 9%), with modest percentages dedicated to depreciation, amortisation, and other operational expenses. This financial structure reflects our strategic reliance on government funding and a deliberate allocation of resources to support key educational and operational priorities.

FUTURE DIRECTIONS

The future direction of North West Christian School has been clearly mapped out in our 2025-2027 strategic plan. This comprehensive blueprint outlines our commitment to delivering an exceptional educational experience that is underpinned by our core values and dedicated to continuous improvement. The plan details a range of initiatives that span from enhancing our purpose, vision, and mission, through to the development of innovative teaching and learning practices, all designed to ensure that our community of staff, students, and parents are engaged and supported.

Our strategic plan reaffirms the importance of a clearly articulated purpose, vision, and mission, which will be visually reinforced across campus and effectively communicated to all stakeholders. At the heart of our ethos is the integration of Christian values, with a structured approach to worship and the intentional teaching of these principles. We are also committed to maintaining transparency by ensuring that all policies and procedures, including comprehensive pastoral care measures compliant with child safe standards, are readily accessible. Additionally, collaboration with Adventist strategic ministries, community service projects, mission trips, and peer support systems further solidifies our focus on building a safe, supportive, and inclusive environment.

In order to support our academic ambitions and nurture continuous improvement, the school is investing in a robust framework for staff professional development and appraisal. This includes the implementation of clear action plans that are communicated and resourced across the school, alongside ongoing opportunities for staff to observe, share, and adopt best practices. A data-driven approach to teaching and learning will further enable teachers to reflect on student performance and personalise instructional strategies, ensuring that our educational delivery is both effective and responsive to individual needs. Comprehensive induction and mentoring programmes also ensure that new and existing staff are well-supported and integrated into the school community.

To further enhance student outcomes, a dedicated teaching and learning coordinator will be appointed to establish a consistent, evidence-based pedagogical framework aligned with the Australian Curriculum. Our strategy also includes the development of innovative learning environments, as well as the establishment of consistent routines and proactive wellbeing programmes. Through these efforts, North West Christian School is poised to deliver an educational experience that is academically rigorous, socially responsible, and centred on the overall wellbeing of every student.
